Manalapan Fire Dist. 2 Re: Opticom project update

During a recent conversation with our contact from NJ DOT we discussed the status of the authorization process to install the Opticom GPS equipment on the DOT traffic signals along the Route 33 corridor. Please see below an itemized status of each traffic signal.

<u>Sweetmans La/Millhurst Rd</u> – All required paperwork has been completed and the DOT is awaiting the developer of Manalapan Crossing to complete their required roadway improvements and releasing the intersection back to DOT. One the intersection has been released we can proceed with coordinating and scheduling installation.

<u>Crossing La</u> – DOT has received correspondence from the board affirming the desire to install preemption equipment. Since this is a newly created intersection, they are in the beginning phases of preparing the agreement documents for review.

Pegasus Blvd - Authorization is in the process of being executed.

<u>Woodward Rd</u> – DOT has received from the developer a request for intersection improvements. Since we have the process in motion to install preemption equipment DOT is placing the responsibility on the developer as part of their intersection improvements.

<u>33 East Turnaround</u> – This agreement is fully executed and we are awaiting DOT to provide the execution agreement to move forward and install.

Smithburg Rd/Iron Ore Rd – DOT states Monmouth County "misplaced" the authorization agreements and has restarted the process. Documents have gone to Millstone Township and returned signed, next are on to Manalapan Township for signature, then on to District 2 and Monmouth County Board of Commissioners.

Equipment has been ordered for the new Chief's vehicles and is in.

Antennas are in the current 66 truck to go and be installed while the truck is being upfitted. Once received we will coordinate with Signal Controls to install the control units.
