FIRE PROTECTION AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT dated this <u></u>_____ day of March, 2011 by and between the Board of Fire Commissioners, Fire District No. 2, Township of Manalapan, County of Monmouth and State of New Jersey hereinafter designated as the "Board", and the Manalapan Township Volunteer Fire Company No. 1 hereinafter designated as the "Company".

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS; the Board of Fire Commissioners, is a duly constituted public agency organized pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:14-70 et. seq.; and

WHEREAS; N.J.S.A. 40A:14-70.1.b. authorizes a Board of Fire Commissioners to contract with a volunteer fire company for the purpose of providing fire protection services upon such terms and conditions as shall be deemed proper; and

WHEREAS; the Company is a duly constituted nonprofit corporation organized pursuant to the laws of the State of New Jersey for the purpose of fire suppression/fire protection services; and

WHEREAS; the parties hereto desire to enter into a contract to define the rights, duties and responsibilities of each regarding the furnishing of fire protection services to the residents of the fire district.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

 <u>TERM</u>: This Agreement shall have a one year duration commencing on March 1, 2011 and terminating, unless otherwise renewed and extended on February 29, 2012. 2. **DUTIES**: The Company covenants and agrees to provide fire protection/fire suppression services to all persons and property situate within the borders of Fire District No. 2, Manalapan Township, Monmouth County, New Jersey and to provide said fire services seven days per week, 24 hours per day, in accordance with any and all applicable rules, regulations, standards and laws of the State of New Jersey and any administrative agency having the necessary and proper jurisdiction to prescribe rules and regulations regarding the conduct of fire fighting services. The Company shall operate and utilize any and all equipment and apparatus supplied by the Board for the purposes of fire suppression in accordance with such rules and regulations as may be adopted by the Board. The Company shall provide such personnel as may be available for the purposes specified herein. The members of the Company shall be under the supervision and control of the Board and in performing fire duty shall be deemed to be exercising a governmental function.

3. <u>BUILDING USE</u>: The Company does hereby specifically grant to the Commissioners the right to use the public meeting room for holding meetings, both public and executive sessions, and to use the building as a polling place for such elections as may be required to be held within the District, subject only to the requirement that the Commissioners notify the Company in advance of their intention to use the building for such purposes and also subject to the requirement that such use will not interfere with normal operations of the fire company. The Company hereby leases to the Board the equipment bays and office space for the purpose of equipment and apparatus storage and the conduct of fire district business activities.

4. <u>CONSIDERATION</u>: The Board shall pay the Company, as and for consideration for the promises and covenants contained herein the sum of **\$105,352.00** for the year 2011. All payments hereunder shall be rendered in four equal installments and shall be due and payable on January 2nd, April 1st, July 1st and October 1st of each year covered by the terms of this Agreement.

5. <u>MAINTENANCE AND REPAIR</u>: The Commissioners shall be responsible for the payment of all costs for the maintenance and repair of all fire fighting equipment and apparatus in accordance with the budget adopted by the Board of Fire Commissioners at the annual referendum.

6. **INSURANCE**: The Commissioners shall provide, at no cost or expense to the individual members of the Volunteer Fire Company, such insurance as may be legally required, including but not limited to comprehensive liability, workers compensation and life insurance and shall fund the Length of Service Awards program approved by the voters.

 <u>UTILITIES AND BUILDING MAINTENANCE</u>: The Company shall be responsible for the maintenance of the fire house and shall make all utility payments for telephone, electricity and natural gas.

8. <u>ANNUAL ACCOUNTING</u>: The Company shall provide an annual accounting of all public monies received and expenditures made by it to the Board.

9. <u>SAVINGS CLAUSE</u>: The terms and provisions of this Agreement are subject to such limitations as may be imposed upon either of the parties by statute or ordinance. Should any provision of this Agreement be ruled invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such ruling, shall not affect the remaining provisions of this Agreement.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties have caused this Agreement to be executed by their duly authorized officers and representatives on this _ 2 day of March , 2011.

FIRE PROTECTION AGREEMENT ENGLISHTOWN FIRE DEPARTMENT

WHEREAS; the Board of Fire Commissioners of Fire District No. 2, Township of Manalapan desires to contract with the Englishtown Fire Department for the provision of first response fire protection services to a portion of Manalapan Township; and

WHEREAS; N.J.S.A. 40A:14-26 authorizes the establishment of a contractual relationship between a Fire District and a Volunteer Fire Co. located in a contiguous municipality to insure the provision of first response fire protection services and permits payment therefore.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and promises set forth herein it is hereby agreed as follows:

1. Fire Suppression Services:

The Englishtown Fire Department will provide first response fire suppression services on a 24 hour per day, seven day per week 24 hours per day basis to the hereinafter described area of Manalapan Township. All services rendered by the Englishtown Fire Department will be rendered with the greatest efficiency and care possible and in compliance with all applicable rules, regulations and standards governing fire suppression activities.

In addition to first response services specified above, the Englishtown Fire Department does hereby covenant and agree to provide fire protection in the form of "mutual aid and assistance" to the remaining portion of Fire District No. 2, Township of Manalapan. Said mutual aid and assistance will be provided at no additional cost to the Board of Fire Commissioners of Fire District No. 2, Township of Manalapan. All structural fires in District No. 2 will be dual toned to insure adequate manpower.

2. That portion of Manalapan Fire District No. 2 to be serviced on a first response basis by the Englishtown Fire Department is described as follows:

a. Beginning at the boundary line between the Borough of Englishtown and

the Township of Manalapan on County Route 522 and proceeding in a southeasterly direction along said road to the intersection of County Route 522 and Taylors Mill Road; thence in a southwesterly direction across Country to the location of the Yorktown Club on County Route 527, and Dye Grove Road; thence proceeding in a westerly direction to the intersection of Iron Ore Road, alternate Route 527, and Dye Grove Road; thence following Dye Grove Road in a westerly direction to the border between Middlesex County and Monmouth County; thence proceeding in a northeasterly direction along said border to Pension Road; thence in a southerly direction along Pension Road to its intersection of Corner Road; thence in a westerly direction along said road to the border of the Borough of Englishtown and the Township of Manalapan; thence in a southerly direction along said border to the starting point of this description at County Route 522.

3. Term: This agreement shall remain in full force and effect for a period of one (1) years commencing March 1, 2011 to February 29, 2012.

4. Consideration: The Board of Fire Commissioners of Fire District No. 2, Township of Manalapan shall pay as consideration for the services to be rendered by the Englishtown Fire Department the sum of \$36,167.00 for the term of this contract. Payments shall be rendered to the Englishtown Fire Department in two equal installments per year with the first installment being due and payable upon receipt by Manalapan Township Fire District No. 2 of the first payment of tax proceeds from Manalapan Township: the second installment shall be due and payable upon the payment of the third installment of tax receipts by Manalapan Township.

Limits on Bid Acceptance Dates 2011 Federal and State Holidays

This Local Finance Notice provides local procurement officials a current list of all 2011 Federal and State holidays for ensuring local compliance with <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A:11-23(a) and <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 18A:18A-21(a) regarding when bids cannot be accepted.

The law places limits on when contracting units can accept bids for local public and public school contracts. The provision in both laws read as follows:

For all contracts, the date fixed for receiving the bids shall not fall on a Monday, or any day directly following a State or federal holiday.

Currently, all Federal holidays are also State holidays, and many of them fall on Mondays. **The law applies whether or not the contracting unit observes a given holiday.** The law supersedes local holiday observance. In addition, the Division advises that the law also applies to receipt of requests for proposals under competitive contracting.

The law does not apply to quotations or professional services, because the "10 days before receipt of bids" requirement does not apply. Also, board of education transportation contracts, pursuant to <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 18A:39-1 et seq., are not governed by the law.

In addition to "no-bid Mondays," the table on Page 2 of this Notice may be helpful to contracting units desiring to use the date following the Monday or holiday in 2011. The full laws are reprinted following the table.

Recipients of this Notice are asked to share it with their procurement staff, governing bodies, chief executive and administrative officers, legal counsel, engineers, and architects. The information should especially be shared with those individuals responsible for the development and preparation of specifications, and for the scheduling and receipt of bids and proposals.

Laws and Rules Related to Postponement and Issuing Addenda to Bids

N.J.A.C. Rules Applying to Local and Public School Contracting Units

5:34-9.3 Cancellation or postponement of receipt of bids or proposal

(a) Publicly announced receipt of bids or competitive contracting proposals shall be considered cancelled when the contracting unit must amend or modify the bid specifications and cannot meet the requirements of N.J.S.A. 40A:11-23 and 18A:18A-21. The following procedures shall be used in the event a contracting unit cancels the receipt of publicly advertised bids or competitive contracting proposals:

- 1. All vendors who have either submitted bids or proposals, or received specifications or request for proposals, shall be notified by telephone, fax, or e-mail that the receipt thereof has been cancelled, the reason therefore, and notification regarding the return of the unopened bids pursuant to this section.
- 2. The contracting unit shall allow vendors to retrieve bids or proposals that had been:
 - i. Submitted at or before the time of cancellation;
 - ii. Previously sent but had not arrived by the time of cancellation; or
 - iii. For those not picked up by a vendor within 10 business days of being notified of their availability, the contracting unit shall return them, unopened, by certified mail or other delivery service that provides a delivery receipt.
- 3. On the day and time originally scheduled for receipt of bids or proposals, a notice shall be posted at the place where bids were to have been received, stating that the receipt of bids or proposals has been cancelled. No bids or proposals are to be received at this time.
- All advertisements for the receipt of rescheduled bids or proposals must adhere to the requirements of N.J.S.A. 40A:11-23 or 18A:18A-21, as appropriate to the contracting unit for the statutory number of days between notice and when new bids or proposals can be received.

(b) Publicly announced receipt of bids or competitive contracting proposals shall be considered postponed when an unforeseen circumstance occurs that would affect or prohibit the opening of bids or proposals. The opening of the bids or proposals must occur within five days, excluding Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays, of the original date of the receipt of bids or proposals. The following procedures shall be used in the event a contracting unit must postpone the receipt of publicly advertised bids or competitive contracting proposals:

- 3. As soon as practicable, all vendors who have either submitted bids or proposals, or received specifications or request for proposals, shall be notified by telephone, fax, or e-mail that the receipt thereof has been postponed and the reason therefore.
- 4. If possible, on the day and time originally scheduled for receipt of bids or proposals, a notice shall be posted at the place where bids were to have been received, stating that the receipt of bids or proposals has been postponed.
- 5. In the event of a postponement, no bids or proposals shall be opened.

1) For all contracts except those for construction work and municipal solid waste collection and disposal service, notice shall be published no later than seven days, Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays excepted, prior to the date for acceptance of bids, in an official newspaper of the contracting unit and be provided to any person who has submitted a bid or who has received a bid package, in one of the following ways: i) in writing by certified mail or ii) by certified facsimile transmission, meaning that the sender's facsimile machine produces a receipt showing date and time of transmission and that the transmission was successful or iii) by a delivery service that provides certification of delivery to the sender.

2) For all contracts for construction work, notice shall be provided no later than seven days, Saturdays, Sundays, or holidays excepted, prior to the date for acceptance of bids, to any person who has submitted a bid or who has received a bid package in any of the following ways: i) in writing by certified mail or ii) by certified facsimile transmission, meaning that the sender's facsimile machine produces a receipt showing date and time of transmission and that the transmission was successful or iii) by a delivery service that provides certification of delivery to the sender.

3) For municipal solid waste collection and disposal contracts, notice shall be published in an official newspaper of the contracting unit and in at least one newspaper of general circulation published in the State no later than seven days, Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays excepted, prior to the date for acceptance of bids.

d. Failure of the contracting unit to advertise for the receipt of bids or to provide proper notification of revisions or addenda to advertisements or bid documents related to bids as prescribed by this section shall prevent the contracting unit from accepting the bids and require the readvertisement for bids pursuant to subsection a. of this section. Failure to obtain a receipt when good faith notice is sent or delivered to the address or telephone facsimile number on file with the contracting unit shall not be considered failure by the contracting unit to provide notice.

c. Notice of revisions or addenda to advertisements or bid documents shall be provided as follows:

(1) For all contracts except those for construction work, notice shall be published no later than seven days, Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays excepted, prior to the date for acceptance of bids, in an official newspaper of the board of education and be provided to any person who has submitted a bid or who has received a bid package, in one of the following ways: (a) in writing by certified mail or (b) by certified facsimile transmission, meaning that the sender's facsimile machine produces a receipt showing date and time of transmission and that the transmission was successful or (c) by a delivery service that provides certification of delivery to the sender.

(2) For all contracts for construction work, notice shall be provided no later than seven days, Saturdays, Sundays, or holidays excepted, prior to the date for acceptance of bids, to any person who

Failure of the board of education to advertise for the receipt of bids or to provide proper notification of revisions or addenda to advertisements or bid documents related to bids as prescribed by this section shall prevent the board of education from accepting the bids and require the readvertisement for bids pursuant to subsection a. of this section. Failure to obtain a receipt when good faith notice is sent or delivered to the address or telephone facsimile number on file with the board of education shall not be considered failure by the board of education to provide notice....

Revised Bid and Quote Thresholds for Contracting Units - 01/13/2011

The following guidance is for government agencies that fall under the provisions of the Local Public Contracts Law and the Public School Contracts Law that HAVE NOT APPOINTED a Qualified Purchasing Agent.

On January 1, 2011, the provisions of the revisions to Qualified Purchasing Agent laws (P.L. 2009, c.166) took effect. There is one important element that has an immediate impact on contracting units that have not appointed a Qualified Purchasing Agent as of January 1, 2011. Other parts of the law do not have immediate effect and the Division will soon release a comprehensive review of the law.

Contracting units who do not currently have named a Qualified Purchasing Agent (pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:11-9 and N.J.A.C. 5:34-5) now have a bid threshold of \$17,500, regardless of any prior local actions that provide a higher threshold. For these contracting units, this change supersedes the bid threshold changes announced in Local Finance Notice 2010-13.

These contracting units now also have a quotation threshold of \$2,625 (15% of the bid threshold). The \$17,500 amount is consistent with State laws concerning compliance with "pay-to-play" laws. The foregoing also applies to those contracting units who may have a QPA on staff but have not actively named that person as the QPA for that contracting unit. N.J.A.C. 5:34-5.2 provides the procedures for appointing QPA and how to increase the bid threshold up to the statutory maximum of \$36,000. 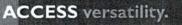
