On April 6, 1995 at approximately 12:00 I received a telephone call from Mr. Walsh. He informed me that he was performing tank removal at the fire house and that his employees had uncovered an on-site spill. I advised him that the tank removal had to be carried out in complete compliance with any and all applicable statutes and administrative regulations. He stated that he knew that fact and would proceed to take the necessary steps in accordance with the New Jersey Administrative Code.

At this point in time, he estimated that he would require 3 truckloads of clean fill to fill in the excavation. He also informed me that his workman would store the contaminated soil on a plastic ground cover until arrangements could be made for it to be removed from site and properly disposed of.

A full report will be provided to the Board. It is important to note, however, that the contamination was an unexpected event on site and a contract change order will be required to cover the costs of the additional work required to be performed by the contractor. As of the date of the writing of this memorandum, I do not have an estimate as to the costs of the additional work. I will keep the Board informed of progress on this point.






