

Please be advised that the undersigned is attorney for the Board of Fire Commissioners Fire District No.2 Manalapan Township Monmouth County. My client wishes to formally object to the application of Gordon's Corner Water Company for an increase in the Public Fire Service Hydrants charge. The application states that Gordon's Corner Water Company is requesting a 4.00% increase in the annual hydrant fee to \$422.70.

As you know fire districts, like every other unit of local government, operate under a 2% hard budget cap. This cap was imposed for the ostensible purpose of controlling the increase in costs of municipal government to provide a modicum of relief to hard-pressed taxpayers in our State. The most recent analysis available reports that New Jersey is, in fact, the most expensive State in the Union in which to live due, in no small part, to New Jersey's extremely high real property tax rates.

It is my client's position that allowing a hydrant rental fee increase in the amount of 4.00% while municipal governments must limit budgetary increases to only 2.00% per budget cycle runs counter to sound fiscal policy and is detrimental to the aim of long-term tax stability embodied in State law and governmental policy.

The Board of Fire Commissioners respectfully draws your attention to the fact that "Public Fire Service Hydrant" fees or charges should take into account the basic fact that fire hydrants are only used in emergency situations and are therefore infrequently utilized by fire departments. Hydrants are a "standby service" and the amount of water actually used in any given year is miniscule in relation to average residential and commercial consumption.

It is therefore, respectfully requested that any increase in Public Fire Service Hydrant fees be limited to 2.00% thereby keeping it in line with the 2.00% hard cap mandated by law for municipal budgets growth. Allowing the requested rate increase clearly runs counter to the State's policy of restraining public expenditures by limiting budget increases to 2.00% per annum.


