WHEREAS; N.J.S.A. 40A:14-78.17 requires boards of fire commissioners to adopt a temporary budget if the district has financial commitments or payments to be made prior to the adoption of its annual budget at the February referendum; and

WHEREAS: The Board of Fire Commissioners has evaluated its financial commitments and has determined that it must adopt a temporary budget for the period commencing January 1 and ending March 1 of the year 2015; and

WHEREAS; N.J.S.A. 40A:14-78.17 further provides that the District may appropriate a maximum of fourteen percent (14%) of its prior year's total budget, excluding appropriations made for interest and debt redemption charges and capital improvements; and

WHEREAS; Fourteen percent (14%) of the 2014 operating budget, excluding appropriations made for interest and debt redemption charges and capital improvements of Fire District No. 2 Manalapan Township is \$ 137,128.00;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED by the Board of Fire Commissioners of Fire District No.2 Manalapan Township that there is hereby adopted a temporary budget in the amount of \$ 137,128.00 for the above specified time period.

CASH MANAGEMENT PLAN

Be it resolved by the Board of Fire Commissioners Fire District No. 2 of the Township of Manalapan, County of Monmouth, that for the year 2015, the following shall serve as the cash management plan of the Manalapan Township Fire District No. 2.

1. Cash Management and Investment Objectives

The Manalapan Township Fire District No. 2 objectives in this area are:

- A. Preservation of capital.
- Adequate safekeeping of assets.
- Maintenance of liquidity to meet operating needs.
- D. Diversification of the District's portfolio to minimize risks associated with individual investments.
- E. Investment of assets in accordance with State and Federal Laws and regulations.

2. <u>Designation of Official Depositories</u>

- The following Government Unit Depository Protection Act (GUDPA) approved banks are authorized depositories for deposit of funds: Brunswick Bank & Trust.
- Designated official depositories are required to submit to the Treasurer a copy of the Governmental Unit Deposit Protection Act Notification of eligibility, which is filed semi-annually with the Department of Banking each June 30th and December 31st of each year.
- Designated official depositories are required to submit to the Treasurer a copy of the institution's "Annual Report" on an annual basis.

Designation of Security Broker/Dealers

The following are approved security broker/dealers: None

4. Cash Management

- All funds shall be deposited within 48 hours of receipt in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:5-15.
- The Treasurer shall minimize the possibility of idle cash accumulating in accounts by assuring that the amounts in excess of negotiated compensating balances are kept in interest bearing accounts or promptly swept into the investment portfolio.
- The method of calculating banking fees and compensating balances shall be reviewed on a monthly basis.
- Investment decisions shall be guided by the cash flow projections prepared by the Treasurer.

5. Permissible Investments

- Bonds or other obligations of the United States of America or obligations guaranteed by the United States of America.
- Government money market mutual funds.
- Any federal agency or instrumentality obligation authorized by Congress that matures within 397 days form the date of purchase, and has a fixed rate of interest not dependent on any index or external factors.
- Bonds or other obligations of the local unit or school districts of which the local unit is a part of.
- Any other obligations with maturities not exceeding 397 days, as permitted by the Division of Investments.
- Local government investment pools.
- New Jersey State Cash Management Fund.
- Repurchase agreements of fully collateralized securities.

6. Authority for Investment Management

 The Treasurer is authorized and directed to make investments on behalf of the District. All investment decisions shall be consistent with this plan and all appropriate regulatory constraints.

7 Safekeeping

 Securities purchased on behalf of the District shall be delivered electronically or physically to the District's custodial bank, which shall maintain custodial and/or safekeeping accounts for such securities on behalf of the District.

8. Reporting

1. The Treasurer shall report to the Board of Fire Commissioners all purchases of investments in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:5-15.2.

9. Audit

 The Cash Management Plan shall be subject to annual audit conducted pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:5-14.

10. Disposition of Abandoned Property

 The Treasurer shall escheat to the State of New Jersey Checks which remain outstanding for twelve or more months after the date of issuance.
