Provide the dealer with the VIN of your vehicle and request a service date for Customer Satisfaction Program 16N01. The VIN is printed near your name at the beginning of this letter. Your dealer will perform the repair at no charge.

If you do not already have a servicing dealer, you can access www.Fordowner.com for dealer addresses, maps, and driving instructions.

Have you previously paid for this repair?

If you paid to have this service done before the date of this letter, you may be eligible for a refund. Refunds will only be provided for service related to paint peeling and/or rust around the rear lock cylinder.
